






standout Composed of fluidly continuous forms, this oval structure embodies the speed, dynamism, balance, and skill of the skaters—professional and amateur—who glide across the 145,000 square feet of ice comprising a 400-meter elliptical track and two Olympic-size rinks. A 360-degree ribbon of windows connects the interior to the rolling landscape outside, which includes a beloved community skating rink.
